Take I-495 (Capital Beltway) to Exit 54A/54B (Braddock Road)

Go 1.5 miles west toward Fairfax
Turn left at traffic signal onto Burke Lake Road.
Go about 0.3 miles, turning right into the fourth driveway after crossing through the traffic signal at the Rolling Road intersection. If you pull into first, second, or third driveway, drive to the library along the frontage road.

Tysons Development Plan

Supervisor Herrity has conducted an analysis of the workforce housing policy as contained in the Tysons plan and expresses an interesting contrarian position. The plan calls for subsidizing housing for a family of four earning up to \$120,000 per year. The developer contributions (proffers) will amount to \$500 million for subsidized housing alone. Approximately 60% of the families in Fairfax County will qualify for this subsidized housing.
