

**Fairfax County Federation of Citizens Association Public Safety Committee  
Draft FY2021 Budget Resolution**

**Public Safety**

**WHEREAS**, the FY2021 Advertised Budget includes \$10.36 Million for Safety and Security which funds 51 positions; and

**WHEREAS**, these funds support the Police Department Body-Worn Cameras Program; Staffing for the Scotts Run Fire Station; South County Police Station Staffing; Increase in E-911 Call Capacity; Information Technology Requirements; Electronic Control Weapons (Tasers); and

**WHEREAS**, the FY2021 Advertised Budget includes an additional \$3.07 Million for 21 positions which funds expansion of the Diversion First Initiative and Opioid Task Force; and

**WHEREAS**, the FY2021 Advertised Budget includes a 2.06% Market Rate Adjustment, Performance, Merit, and Longevity increases for General and Uniformed Public Safety personnel; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** based on all the foregoing that the Fairfax County Federation of Citizens Associations urges the Board of Supervisors to take the following actions in adopting the FY 2021 Fairfax County Budget for Public Safety:
